# **Government Corner**

## A letter from your Town Administrator

Dear Boonville Residents,

As we wrap up fiscal year 2016-2017, the Town of Boonville has a lot to look forward to in the next fiscal year.

Recently, the Town was awarded 88 bicycle helmets which will be distributed to low income children through the Bicycle Helmet Grant Initiative. The grant is made possible through the "Share the Road" specialty license plate initiative and is distributed by the NC Department of Transportation (NCDOT). The Town applied for the grant to host a bicycle safety and education program in partnership with the Boonville Police Department, Boonville Elementary School, Boonville Business and Downtown Development Association, and the Boonville Community Volunteer Fire Department. This program will be completed by the end of the calendar year.

The Town has also been selected in the recent draft of the State Transportation Improvement Program for \$820,000.00 of improvements at the main intersection of NC 67 and US Hwy 601. This project will be funded in fiscal year 2019 and constructed in 2020. Details of the scope of the project have not yet been released by NCDOT.

Water and Sewer infrastructure upgrades continue to move forward into the next fiscal year. We are continuing to address issues with the tanks at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. As mentioned in the spring newsletter, we had have had a few setbacks pertaining to ground water. However, we still expect this project to be completed by mid-November.
