## Government Corner

### A letter from your Town Administrator

Dear Boonville Residents,

Fall has officially arrived and so has our newest edition of the newsletter! The Town of Boonville continues to move forward with water and sewer infrastructure upgrades. Since our last update, the Town of Boonville has contracted with a new engineering firm, WithersRavenel, to explore options at our wastewater treatment plant.

Part A of the water project is in the process of being closed

Leaf collection will begin November 1st and will continue through January 1st.

Leaves should not be raked to the pick-up location until the last week of October. This helps reduce the scattering of leaves on windy days.

Rake leaves into a neat row or pile at the street's edge if no sidewalk exists. If a sidewalk borders the street, locate leaves along the yard-side edge and off the sidewalk. The aim is to keep leaves safely out of the way of traffic and pedestrian walkways

out, and we hope to have a contract for Part B before the end of the year. Part B will include rehabilitation of three existing well houses and full development of our recently tapped well site.

Along with these infrastructure improvements, NCDOT recently hosted a public meeting on the planned upgrades at the intersection of NC 67 and US 601. These proposed upgrades include a new rightturn lane on US 601 southbound, and NC 67 will have left-turn lanes east and west bound. Improvements will also include curb, gutter, sidewalks, and an addition of pedestrian cross walks and signals in the area. NCDOT plans to begin acquiring land in June 2019 with construction projected to begin n June 2020. Overall, this project is estimated to include upgrades of \$2.5 million dollars with the option for the Town to add additional beautification upgrades.

while keeping them visible and accessible to town employees. Placing leaves too far into the streets or on sidewalks can be hazardous to citizens and pets as they attempt to avoid them. The town's primary collection method involves leafvacuuming equipment, so raked leaves must be easily accessible by all leaf-collection vehicles and equipment.

We ask you to not mix trash or limbs with leaves to be picked up. It is preferable that leaves not be bagged during this season unless you have a small amount that may not be
